Church Partner:

Harbor Community Church: Harbor Community Church is a nine-year old church plant that began ministering in New Orleans after Hurricane Katrina. In the short history of Harbor, they have seen amazing growth as they have created an environment where broken people and those far from God come together to engage in worship, small groups and service.

Ministry Partner:

Hope Missions: Hope Missions has strategic partnerships with local churches in National and International locations. These churches work with Hope Missions to provide lodging and meals. Other churches in the community come together to provide meaningful ministry and construction projects. Every project is a platform to present the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Additional Community Organizations and Ministries:

New Orleans Mission-The New Orleans Mission provides shelter and food for the homeless population of New Orleans.

Ronald McDonald House - Ronald McDonald House Charities endeavors to take that worry off an overwhelmed family's mind. They offer them a "home-away-from-home," with comfortable beds, hot showers, laundry facilities, playrooms, a friendly kitchen and stocked pantry. Most importantly, they provide an environment with a built-in support system where families help each other.

Second Harvest- Second Harvest Food Bank is leading the fight against hunger in South Louisiana by providing food access, advocacy, education, and disaster response. Second Harvest provides food to 474 partners and programs across 23 parishes. Together, we make up the largest anti-hunger network in the state.

Saint Lukes Medical Center- St. Luke's Medical Center is a nursing home that serves the residents of Greater New Orleans, Orleans Parish, and Jefferson Parish, provides premiere care and assistance.

The Magnolia School- Works to serve adults with developmental disabilities, Magnolia Community Services is known for its leadership, advocacy and high quality services.

The St. Bernard Project- Bernard Project's mission is to shorten the time between disaster and full recovery by ensuring that disaster-impacted citizens and communities recover in a prompt, efficient and predictable manner.
